Homelessness	At the start of the year, the CLS will distribute the Project-UpStart forms to all students and will also meet with parents to help them access support from community agencies as needed. Additionally, the TRUST counselor will manage our school food bank to ensure meals are sent home on Fridays. In collaboration with our community partners, we will offer extra assistance to students and families in finding emergency shelter.			
Work Scheduling Conflict	Many parents juggle multiple jobs or shifts, making it difficult for them to attend regularly scheduled school events. To address this, our Action Plan will include offering meetings at different times to encourage parental involvement in their children's education. We will also offer meetings on zoom. This objective is also part of our Parent-School Compact. Furthermore, our CLS, TRUST Counselor, and Mental Health Coordinator will collaborate with families to ensure that the social, emotional, and educational needs of our students are met.
